• GENERAL COURSE

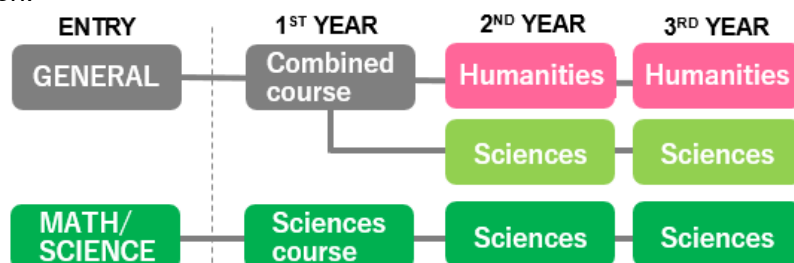
We foster students who are competent, have a broad knowledge and contribute to society. We deliver curricula aimed at preparing students for highly selective universities. We put emphasis not only on studying but also developing their creative, logical and critical thinking skills. In addition, we have extracurricular classes and seminars to improve students' employability.

• MATH/SCIENCE COURSE

We develop students who can be actively involved in the field of science, engineering and medicine, and who can contribute to society in the future. Our curriculum enables students to enroll in the highest quality colleges and medical faculties. This course includes special research projects, school trips and seminars by college professors.

◆SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Students apply to one of two courses of study prior to taking the school's entrance examination. These "entry courses" include a general course and an intensive Math/Science course. General course students choose a specialization for their second and third years. In the third year, we offer comprehensive classes to meet students' requirements for passing the examinations for tertiary education.

We have three big school events, which are the "Sho-kyu-sai," a cultural festival, "Dai-undokai," a sports day, and "Yosenkai," a farewell party for 3rd year students. All the events are planned, organized and directed by students. Students really enjoy these events.



◆ MAJOR SCHOOL EVENTS

Students have three big traditional events, which have been passed down from generation to generation. These events are mainly managed by students with a slogan of “Be cheerful, joyful and lively”. Although the style of events may change depending on social conditions, the spirit of our school will live on no matter how many years go by.

• *SHO-KYU-SAI*

In this culture festival, each class will show a piece of cultural work, the theme of which differs by grade year. Culture clubs and volunteers will also have performances. Moreover, this big two-day event is open for participation by student's families and neighbors.



• *DAI-UNDOUKAI*

In this sports festival, all students are divided into four teams and compete against each other. Cheerleading performances, dance, and other group activities are highlights of this event. Each team draws up their plan for an original performance and practices for it. After the sports festival, whether students have won or lost, they feel a sense of achievement, because they have all done their best.



• *YOSENKAI*

This is a farewell party for 3rd year students studying for the college examinations. In this event, volunteers from 1st and 2nd year students cheer for their upper classmates with gratitude. There are various performances such as skits, music performances and videos.



◆MATH/SCIENCE COURSE

It is 30 years since the Math/Science course started. Every year, 40 students from class 11 study advanced math and advanced science in addition to general core courses, cultivating specialists who will be able to be actively involved in the field of science, engineering and medicine, and will contribute to society in the future.

There are special Math/Science course events in addition to the regular school events. Students lead a fulfilling school life.
